Word Becomes Flesh

The title above is a phrase familiar to Christians. These are words from John 1:14, part of the gospel reading for Christmas Day in our lectionary. We know that Jesus, our Savior, the Word of God, was born in a manger. He became flesh and blood, just like the crown of His creation, so that He could save us from our sin.

In Luther's sermons on the Gospel of John, he explains in some detail why it is so important that our Savior be both God and man. The excerpt below gives only his succinct answer. Readers are encouraged to find a copy to read more.

To sum up, we must, first of all, have a Savior who can save us from the power of sin and death. This means that He must be the true, eternal God, through whom all believers in Him become righteous and are saved.

But, secondly, we must have a Savior who is also our Brother, who is our flesh and blood. "In the beginning was the Word"; "this Word," he added later, "became flesh."

Attached to today's Panther Patter is the January 2018 calendar. Please note that school resumes Thursday, January 4, 2018.

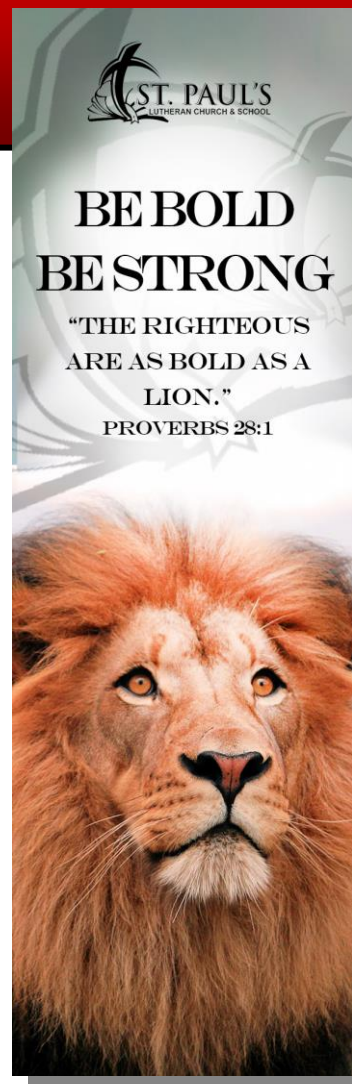
PANTHER SPORT SHORTS
